Key Line

“The Entry.”

Introduction

Recently we have been in our Movement series, talking about the movements that Jesus made in the New Testament and how we can live in light of them. This past week we talked about how Jesus intentionally stopped for other people. This week, we are talking about Jesus’ entry as King. Specifically, we are talking about Jesus’ triumphal entry into Jerusalem.

- What has been the best, funniest, or coolest introduction you have seen someone do? (How they arrive to a party, how a character is introduced in a movie, the first time you met someone, etc.)

Seek the Word

Read Mark 11:1-18

- What does Jesus’ reaction to what was happening in the temple tell us about his character?
- How does our passage explain who Jesus is?
- What does the story about the fig tree tell us about the power of Jesus?

Read Colossians 2:13-15

- What might verse 13 mean when it says we were “dead in sin”?
- Why might verse 15 have chose to use the word “triumph” when talking about what Jesus did?

Go Deeper

Our passage this week shows how Jesus fulfills some prophecies in the Old Testament. Take some time to read through the different prophecies Jesus fulfilled. Take note of the ones you already knew about and which ones you were unfamiliar with. A Bible concordance or the Blue Letter Bible website may be helpful.

Talk About It

- Do you find yourself thinking more about how Jesus saved you or what he has saved you from? Why?
- Our passage is about how Jesus is King. What imagery does this remind you of? Do you like to think of Jesus as King or as another title?
- What piece of your life can you say “The Lord needs it” to? How can you give that piece of your life to Him?
- What is God asking you to do next? (Examples: Baptism, prayer, repentance, telling someone about Him, etc.)

Wrap Up

Reminder: “The Lord needs it.”

Challenge: This week, choose one area of your life to give to God. It can be whatever you feel called to give to God. Your speech, the shows you watch, how you act at work, etc. The Lord wants to use you in every area of your life. Whenever you find yourself in the situation you chose, say a prayer asking God to use you. Practice being Christ-like in those moments.
