Introduction

Seek the Word

Read Acts 17.

- Why is it a big deal that Paul was preaching “foreign gods”?
- What caused Paul’s distress in verse 16?
- What are some differences between the gods the Athenians worshipped and the God Paul worshipped?
- How does this passage show us God’s heart for people?

Go Deeper

In our passage this week, Acts 17, Paul went to Athens. Paul went here while on his second missionary journey. Using your Bible, create an outline of where Paul went on his missionary journeys. Consider highlighting main themes or who he traveled with. All of his missionary journeys can be found in the book of Acts.

Talk About It

- Who is someone that has influenced your walk with Jesus positively? What did they do that was impactful?
- Where do you most often find yourself with people who do not follow Jesus?
- How have you experienced God’s faithfulness recently?
- What is one way you can practically show God’s love to others this week?

Wrap Up
